Power of Prayer

Bedtime prayer can be a meaningful way to spend time with God every evening, talking over your day, sharing your concerns with Him, and thanking Him for His love and care. But why should we take time to pray before bed each night?

Praying at night as you fall asleep gives you the chance to look back over the day and thank God for His help and His blessings. We often miss the hand of God in our lives as we run from one activity to another. We lose sight of the good gifts our heavenly Father is giving us (James 1:17) and focus instead on our troubles and worries.

Scripture tells us to "fix our eyes on Jesus" so that we do not "grow weary and lose heart

(Hebrews 12:2-3). Whether life feels overwhelming or dull, a time of prayer at the end of each day can help you refocus on God's goodness and reflect on your priorities and purpose (<u>Matthew 28:19-20</u>).

Relationships flourish when they are nurtured. Spending time talking with God before bed is a way of loving Him and deepening your relationship with Him. The evening is a lonely part of the day for many people. Choosing to pray before bed each night means that you can look forward to enjoying time with One whose love for you is deep (Ephesians 3:18-19) and constant (Romans 8:37-39).

Redeem the night-time you lie in bed waiting for sleep to come. If your mind is a blank, worries and temptations will creep in to fill it. Pain that was background noise during your busy day can blare like a siren when you are lying in the quiet and the dark. Reaching for your phone to distract you will only keep you awake. Rehashing conversations and running the numbers will only feed your anxiety.

Instead, release your worries and the pressures of the day by taking them to the One who has the power to help you and give you peace. Calm and relaxed, you will likely drift off to sleep long before you have prayed for each of your family members and friends, and that is perfectly okay.

From The Pastor's Desk...

I want to tell you about an exciting opportunity that Olive Branch Baptist Church has. About a month ago, our church was approached by an organization called Child Evangelism Fellowship, and they have asked us to partner with them, and go into Frazier Elementary School which is located in Perryopolis, PA and start a Good News Club.

First, who is Child Evangelism Fellowship CEF? CEF is a Bible-centered organization composed of born-again believers whose purpose is to evangelize boys and girls with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and to establish (disciple) them in the Word of God and in a local church for Christian living.

Secondly, what is a Good News Club? Good News Club is an after-school, Bible-based club held in public school buildings. Clubs meet one day per week for seven weeks in both the first and second semester of the school year and are usually held for 1.5 hours. Most clubs include grades 1-6 and some even accommodate Kindergarten children. Children may only attend with parental consent. Each week, trained volunteers present an exciting Bible lesson, lead singing, teach Bible verses, share a missionary story, play review games and build relationships with children through small group mentoring. Every child is given a take-home devotional booklet to encourage spending daily time with God. Good News Clubs aim to fulfill the three main purposes of CEF:

- 1. To **evangelize** children with the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2. To **disciple** children in the Word of God.
- 3. To **connect** children to a local church for Christian living.

Kathy Sloan, a representative for CEF will be here on Saturday, April 6th and Sunday, April 7th during the worship service to speak to you about the "Good News Club. And then on April 7th after the worship service, the church board will meet to discuss our partnering with CEF to start a "Good News Club" in Frazier Elementary.




During the months of April and May we will be reading the book, "The Cat That God Sent" by Jim Kraus.

From the Kitchen

Lemon Rice with Turkey or Chicken

Brown rice is great in this dish. It gives the subtle nutty flavor and chewier texture than white rice. And, if I may note, is much healthier. I've also learned to cook with as few dishes to wash after dinner as possible. While one part of the meal is cooking, I'm washing the pan or dish used for the first part. For example, after the rice is boiled whether Success in a bag or from scratch in the

pan, I wash the pan while browning the meat. Also, keeping hot, detergent water in the sink while cooking is a good idea. Finished cooking, the skillet and utensils are rinsed in cool water and soaked in the hot, detergent water and a scrubber or SOS and I'm good to go. When finished eating, the sink is cleaned except the ones on which I ate---and they go in the dish washer. This works especially if you are having left overs. Yipee—I am now ready to relax for the evening.

1 cup Green Onions, chopped; 1 cup chicken broth; 2 cloves of garlic finely chopped

1 ½ pounds of uncooked turkey breast slices, cut into strips (Or I use thin sliced chicken breast slices);

3 cups cooked brown rice (or white if you prefer); 2 tsp grated lemon peel

1/3 cup lemon juice

1 tbsp capers rinsed and drained

1/4 tsp pepper (uh, no, I'll pass on the pepper)

3 Tbsp chopped fresh parsley

You could also add some steamed broccoli or carrots, be creative!

Cook onions, broth and garlic in a 12-inch nonstick skillet over medium heat for 3 minutes, stirring occasionally, until onions are tender. Stir in turkey or chicken and cook 3 minutes.

Stir in remaining ingredients except parsley. Cook about 3 minutes or until rice is hot and turkey or chicken is no longer pink in center; remove from heat and stir in parsley.

Easy, healthy, good tasting. And I am going to have this dish soon!!!!

A Second Chance

Joni's Page

April, I can hardly believe one quarter of 2024 is gone. As I started this page, I stopped to ask myself, did I make a difference to anyone or anything yet? Time has wings, and I decided to make a difference somewhere daily or another quarter will be gone before I can blink. Did you ever feel that way?

FOCUS

As an old Russian proverb put it, "If you chase two rabbits, you'll not catch either one."

Gilbert Tuhabonye is one of the best runners in the world—a skill he developed when he had to literally run for his life as a boy in Burundi. In October, 1993, Gilbert was sitting in his high school class. He's developed a love for track and field events in junior high, and he could hardly wait to tear around the track again. But that day, the simple routines of the classroom were shattered by Hutu terrorists. The school was invaded by hostile members of the tribe, who descended on the children with genocidal rage. More than a hundred Tutsi children and their teachers were forced into a small room and hacked to death with machetes or burned alive.

Gilbert wasn't killed, but he found himself at the bottom of a pile, buried under the burning corpses of his classmates. The smoldering fire ate into Gilbert's skin, but he remained hidden for more than 9 hours. Finally, Gilbert smashed through a window and took off like an arrow. The Hutus chased him, but Gilbert outran them and made it to a local hospital, where doctors told him he would never run again.

Gilbert didn't believe the doctors. He felt God had spared him and that the Lord had a plan for his life. "I always knew that my faith would be tested, and it certainly was in those hours when my school was attacked. My belief in God never faltered. I never blamed Him or wondered how He could have let such a thing happen to me or to my classmates and teachers. I accepted what was taking place and knew that it was all part of a plan much larger than me."

Gilbert persevered until he was running well enough to win the Burundi National Championship in the 400 and 800 meters. His coaches felt he had Olympic potential, and he was sent to the United States as part of an Olympic training program. There, Abilene Christian University offered him a scholarship.

After graduation, Gilbert moved to Austin to coach young runners, and soon his ministry was off and running. His books, speeches, and coaching have touched thousands of lives. What's more, Gilbert started the Gazelle Foundation, whose slogan is "Run for the Water," to fund and build clean water projects for the people of Burundi. His "Gilbert's Gazelles" training group provides motivation and help to runners of all ages at all levels. **~Written by David Jeremiah**

Writings From the Bible

Thís month, let's take a look at I Samuel There are such great lessons ín thís book. I've been reading ít.

Have you ever changed your initial impression of someone after getting to know them? Because we are not born with X-ray vision, we base our opinions on what we can see. Sometimes we take an instant dislike to people because of their mannerisms, style of dress, momentary expressions, or stated opinions. God sees through all those externals in one glance, for He X-rays the heart. That's one of the main lessons of I Samuel, which tells about three leaders-Samuel (chapters 1-8), Saul (chapters 9-15), and David (chapters 16-31). The stories of the three overlap but the chapter divisions clearly show how the storyline changes from one to the other-Samuel, the seasoned leader; Saul, the foolish one (who learned that in lying to and disobeying God, you will lose it all.); and David the emerging one. Despite his wisdom, Samuel missed seeing David's potential. He was the youngest of Jesse's sons, not as impressive as his older, taller siblings with their impressive faces. Yet God saw in young David "a man after His own heart" (I Samuel 13:14). There are two lessons for us in this. First, we shouldn't be overly concerned about how impressive we appear to others. Our beauty should not be primarily outward, but the hidden person of the heart (I Peter 3:3-4) Second, we ought to be cautious in jumping to conclusions about others. Ask God to give you a discerning mind so you can better see with God's eyesight. The person you least like may be the one God wants you to most love.

KEY THEME

Don't judge by first impressions, for God doesn't look at people as we do. We look at the external appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.

KEY CHALLENGE

As you prepare for your day each morning, ask the Lord to give you a cheerful spirit and a smile to begin your day---be ready and willing to accept others as God has accepted you.

KEY VERSE

But the Lord said to Samuel, 'Do not look at is appearance or at his physical stature, because I have refused him. For the Lord does not see as man sees; for man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (I Samuel 16:7)

KEY PRAYER

Dear God, please help me see others through Your eyes and not as the world sees them. I praise You for forgiving and accepting me—my Lord and the Rock of my salvation.


